#### **AURAL TESTS:**

- Clapping the pulse of a short piece with 2 (including § for Grade 2) or 3 beats in a bar. The candidate should join in as the examiner plays, emphasising the first beat of each bar. The candidate will then be asked whether the piece was in 2 or 3 time.
- The examiner will play the key-chord and tonic and, following a count-in, 3 short phrases within a range of 3 notes in a major key (5 notes for Grade 2), which the candidate should sing back without a pause.
- A 2 bar phrase will be played and then repeated with a slight change in rhythm *(rhythm or melody for Grade 2)*. The candidate will be asked to identify and describe the change.
- The candidate will be asked questions relating to the dynamics and articulation of a short piece (also tempo for Grade 2), after it has been played by the examiner. Responses should demonstrate an understanding of Italian terms.
